Message from Alistair-

The so-called 'Lord's Prayer' was given by Jesus as a model of what genuine Christian prayer is like. According to Matthew, Jesus gave it as a pattern to copy [Matthew 6:9- 'This, then, is how you should pray:]. According to Luke, Jesus gave it as a form to use [Luke 11:2- 'When you pray, say:]. We are not obliged to choose, however, for we can use the prayer as it stands and also model our own praying upon it.

However, perhaps many of us have trouble relating to the part of the Lord's Prayer that says, 'Give us each day our daily bread'- Luke 11:3. Our supermarkets have plenty of food, our fridges, freezers and cupboards are generally well-stocked, and our bellies are usually full. Perhaps we're more likely to pray for self-control and ask God to help us with our diet or not to eat so much! In the western world, you'll find bookshops full of books about losing weight, but not so many about surviving starvation!

But that doesn't negate the importance of the prayer, however, just the opposite. Hopefully, at some point it will occur to us that someone is providing for our needs. And asking for our daily bread is an expression of ultimate dependence on God for everything. Martin Luther had the wisdom to see that 'bread' was a symbol for 'everything necessary for the preservation of this life, like food, a healthy body, good weather, house, home, wife, children, good government and peace.' Perhaps we should also add that by 'bread' Jesus meant the necessities of life rather than the luxuries.

It's good to acknowledge with David in the Old Testament, 'Everything comes from you, and we have given you only what comes from your hand'- 1Chronicles 29:14. You see, long before you knew you needed someone to provide for your needs, God already had.

From George Hill - Bible Reading Week starting Sunday 4th February-

As Christians, all of us are encouraged to put our roots deep into God's Word, the Bible. If you have attended church for some years, you will hopefully have many Bible verses (probably more than you realise) treasured in your memory.

One verse that you may know is Acts chapter 17 verse 11. The apostle Paul had been telling the Good News of Jesus to the people of Thessalonica, until some troublemakers forced him to flee. As soon as it was night, Paul left for the neighbouring town of Berea, where again he started to share the Good News of Jesus. Luke, the author of the Book of Acts, records what happened next:

'Now the Bereans were of more noble character than the Thessalonians, for they received the message with great eagerness and examined the Scriptures every day to see if what Paul said was true.' [Acts 17:11].

During our Bible Reading Week, in the warm spirit of the Bereans, we will invite you to choose and read at least one passage from the list of six Bible passages we offer you daily. Thus, on each day you will be able to choose to read any (or all!) of:

- One chapter from the Gospels
- One chapter from elsewhere in the New Testament
- One chapter from the Old Testament
- One Psalm or chapter from Proverbs
- One famous passage (probably a familiar one)
- One entire Bible book (usually a very short one) to be read in one go.

We'll provide the list of Bible passages for the start of the Bible Reading Week on February 4th nearer the time. Please watch this space for more info!
