Message from Alistair-

Psalm 23 is no doubt many people's favourite Psalm. In the first 6 verses, the Lord is described as a shepherd and nothing else. And perhaps it's tempting to think that the whole Psalm is about a shepherd and his sheep. [By the way, who was better to write such a poem than David whom the Lord 'took from tending the sheep to be the shepherd of his people'- Psalm 78:70-71].

The difficulty of this is that in verse 5 the metaphorical sheep seem to have a doubly metaphorical table laid for them. Many Bible commentators believe that the final verses of the Psalm change the picture from that of a shepherd and his sheep to that of a host and his guest. The Message version of the Bible translates verse 5 like this, 'You serve me a six-course dinner right in front of my enemies. You revive my drooping head; my cup brims with blessing.'

Some days that seems to be our experience. It's as if God brings out more and more courses of food and we end up loosening our belt- a promotion at work, a friendship, a blessing, a gift. A lifetime of grace. An eternity of joy.

And then there are the other days! Those days where we have to eat the equivalent of broccoli, or indeed sprouts! Our daily bread could be tears, or suffering, or heartache. Our portion may include adversity as well as opportunity.

So next time your plate has more broccoli and kale than steak and chips, just remember who prepared the meal. Even Jesus was given a portion that he found hard to swallow. But with God's help he did. And with God's help we can too.

The Christian Theatre Company: Lamps Collective is coming to Sandbach and will be presenting 'The Passion' at St Mary's Church at 6:00pm on Palm Sunday 24th March 2024. The presentation lasts for approx. 75 minutes with no interval.

This is a wonderful opportunity to invite people along to a moving and memorable retelling of the Easter story through the eyes of Peter, Mary Magdalene and a Roman Centurion called Marcus. Please note that the recommended minimum age is 12+.

Tickets are £5.00 and must be purchased in advance, but we are also offering a "pay forward" service, if you know of anyone who would like to come but can't afford the ticket price. This is also ideal if you are unable to come but would still like to donate to the event.

Tickets and flyers will hopefully be available from early/mid-February. You will be able to get them from me, but please let me know as soon as possible if you are interested in attending so we can gauge the response.

We have also been asked to provide accommodation and a meal to the team to help reduce costs and therefore if anyone can support the team in this way, please let me know.

We are all very excited to be able to bring the Easter story to our Town in a fresh and new way and hope you will be able to support the event through prayer and by inviting people along.

From George Hill - Bible Reading Week starting Sunday 4th February-

As Christians, all of us are encouraged to put our roots deep into God's Word, the Bible. If you have attended church for some years, you will hopefully have many Bible verses (probably more than you realise) treasured in your memory.

One verse that you may know is Acts chapter 17 verse 11. The apostle Paul had been telling the Good News of Jesus to the people of Thessalonica, until some troublemakers forced him to flee. As soon as it was night, Paul left for the neighbouring town of Berea, where again he started to share the Good News of Jesus. Luke, the author of the Book of Acts, records what happened next:

'Now the Bereans were of more noble character than the Thessalonians, for they received the message with great eagerness and examined the Scriptures every day to see if what Paul said was true.' [Acts 17:11].

During our Bible Reading Week, in the warm spirit of the Bereans, we will invite you to choose and read at least one passage from the list of six Bible passages we offer you daily. Thus, on each day you will be able to choose to read any (or all!) of:

- One chapter from the Gospels
- One chapter from elsewhere in the New Testament
- One chapter from the Old Testament
- One Psalm or chapter from Proverbs
- One famous passage (probably a familiar one)
- One entire Bible book (usually a very short one) to be read in one go.

We'll provide the list of Bible passages for the start of the Bible Reading Week on February 4th nearer the time. Please watch this space for more info!
