Message from Alistair-

There is an old saying that "Actions speak louder than words." And over the years, I've met so many people from whom the fruit of the Spirit just shines out of their lives- love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control- Galatians 5:22-23.

I think of a lady who suffered excruciating pain for many years. And towards the end of her life she was admitted to hospital. But even in the midst of terrible suffering, the joy of the Lord just seemed to radiate out from her. And she touched the lives of so many nurses and other patients with her gracious words and joy-filled life.

I think of another lady who struggles to sleep at night. But she has such a heart for God's mission and his people. And so she frequently pours out her heart to the Lord in prayer during the night as she pleads for the advancement of God's kingdom.

The Holy Spirit gave Jesus' apostles the ability to speak in many languages on that day of Pentecost written about in Acts 2. And the same Spirit enables us to speak and to act in winsome ways today. Through the power of the Spirit, God's kingdom is advancing, and he has called and equipped each of us to be his witnesses in whatever circumstances we may find ourselves.

On Sunday, we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit. But our celebration of Pentecost is not so much meant to be talked about as it is to be lived—in word and deed. By the power of the Spirit working through us, our words and fruit-filled actions are the tools God uses to build his kingdom.
