Message from Alistair-

I wonder if you can relate to any of that? Perhaps there's a sense when at times we all feel a bit lost. Should I look for a new job or remain where I am? Should I move nearer my family, retire, take on a new responsibility? Should I volunteer, end a friendship, pursue a hobby, and so on?

One of life's biggest questions is, 'What does God want me to do?' In 2 Samuel 2, King David is faced with a decision. In the course of time, David enquired of the Lord. 'Shall I go up to one of the towns of Judah?' The Lord said, 'Go up.' David asked, 'Where shall I go?' 'To Hebron,' the Lord answered.

David made a habit of running his options past God. If we do the same, then the God who guided David will guide us. And very often God's guidance is step-by-step. What we need to do is learn to trust Him to guide us.
