## **Reflection for the week**

### **Lent Week 1: 'In the wilderness with Jesus' by Hilary Forbes**

"Then Jesus, being filled with the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness ..." (Luke 4:1)

The word 'Lent' comes from an Old English word 'Lencten' which was the word used to mean the season of new growth. Over the years this has been woven into the tradition some Christians follow of 'giving something up for Lent' in the forty days before Easter Sunday, as a kind of echo of Jesus' forty days in the desert, fasting and tempted by the devil.

The Scriptures tell us that Jesus was "led by the Spirit into the wilderness ...". The wilderness of Judea was a wild, rocky, craggy, mountainous scrubland, not like the Sahara Desert that may come to mind of endless sand and sand dunes.

One moment Jesus was being baptised by John with a voice from Heaven declaring that "This is my beloved Son ..." and the next He was in a strange kind of arid exile, in increasing discomfort, including extreme hunger. His mind and body were subject to an onslaught of temptation. Temptation to do the wrong thing we know can be real, powerful, and raw and can even twist the mind to try to justify it. Jesus went through all of this, but he did not succumb, he overcame and "returned in the power of the Spirit ..." (Luke 4:14).

Deserts can be alien and bewildering places, and we can find ourselves in a wilderness suddenly, and unexpectedly. They can also become places where we develop a deeper relationship with God, so let us explore the desert over the next few weeks.

If you feel you are in or find yourself in a lonely wilderness where you cannot seem to get your bearings or are tempted to question whether God has forgotten you. Jesus sees you. He is with you.

"Behold, I will do a new thing. Now it shall spring forth; Shall you not know it?  
I will make a road in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." (Isaiah 43: 19)

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### **From George Hill: TEK URA Tenth Anniversary Meeting**

We and Lynn are going to the TEK URA (Albania) tenth anniversary celebration at Whetstone Baptist Church in Leicester on **Saturday 28 February**. We have at least one car space free and would be delighted to have more company.

TEK URA is our main aid support project from Sandbach Baptist Church, working in needful areas of Albania in Christian care and outreach. Most of the team from TEK URA (At the Bridge) in Tirana, Albania are coming to the UK and this is a huge opportunity to meet them and share their vision, and to celebrate ten years of God's faithfulness to Annie and Dan Dupree and all who they have worked for and with. People from many churches around England will be there. It will be a celebration of stories, people and impact; a reflection, a strengthening of partnerships.

Please ask me or Christine if you might be able to come and would like a lift with us, and/or to see the programme. As a fundraising event, it costs £25 with meals provided. We will be leaving about 8.00am and will be back sometime in the evening.

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### **From the Leadership: 'Exploring the future'**

We held our first 'Exploring the future' session last Saturday 14 February. This was the first of three sessions being led by Rev Neil Brighton (a Transitional Minister with the NWBA), to help us on the path of appointing a new minister. In this one we explored the health of our church and it was a very productive and enjoyable time. There were about 18 of there so we gathered into four groups (with drinks and cake) to discuss the different 'signs of life' in our church. These signs seemed to fall into *activities* (which included many of the mid-week groups) and *attributes* (such as a strong sense of unity and a welcoming heart). There were some themes starting to emerge too (such as the positive and negatives aspects of meeting in a school, a desire to better connect Sunday worship with the rest of the week) so it was a very a positive session and we are looking forward to the next two sessions which will meet on:

##### **Session Two: What are our values?**

This session will look at the things we value as a church. Those things which give our church its character and vibe. As part of the discussion we will try and identify some key priorities for the future.

#### **Monday 20 April 7:00pm – 9:00pm at Oasis**

##### **Session Three: What sort of ministry?**

Our third session will dig into the question of what sort of minister(s) might the church need for the future? Partly to identify the core strengths a future minister will need, but also to ask questions about how we balance the need for a pastor, with our desire to reach the community and grow our work with young people.

*When I became a Christian some 40 or more years ago, if someone was asked to give their testimony, they would tell the story of how they became a Christian. However, as I have grown in the faith my understanding of Testimony has become much broader. I now see testimony as a touch or intervention from God and it may be to a person or it could be to events. A testimony is of course something which we choose to speak out and share with others. Although it maybe something that we have experienced it does not become Testimony until it is shared. Why share?*

- *We are giving God the glory for what He has done.*
- *We are publicly accepting that God has touched our lives.*
- *It is an encouragement to other believers.*
- *What God has done he can do again.*

*Testimony as we would define it has a basis in scripture and a search revealed over 50,000 references to the word testimony in the Bible.*

*The Biblical meaning of testimony extends far beyond mere recounting of events; it embodies a deep spiritual significance that is woven throughout the Scriptures. Testimony in the Bible often symbolises truth and witness. It serves as a declaration of faith and a proclamation of God's works in an individual's life. The act of giving testimony is not merely about sharing personal experiences; it is about affirming the truth of God's presence and actions.*

*At a recent meeting during a time of listening, I had a picture of a small market stall above which was written the words "Testimony Exchange". I thought this a bit strange at the time but in sharing this I realised that sharing out a testimony is an exchange, in speaking or sharing a testimony we are saying that God has touched my life. In exchange we give Him the glory and pass on a faith building, spiritual message to others that they too may have similar experiences.*
